



#### DEFAULT FAVORITE EDITOR

##### **1- Question : February 26, 2008**

In the file options; it seems to default the favorite editor as *Notepad.exe*. Is this correct?

##### **Answer**

This is correct; this parameter is used to specify the editor used to open text files. It is not related to the reports.

##### **2- Question : June 18, 2009**

On the wind profile command shows the wind speed in in/s. How do you get it to be in mph?

##### **Answer**

The wind speed can be changed to mph by changing the "Fluid velocities" from the "Tools- Unit System" command. Then you can click on the "Save as Default Units" button to make this unit your default unit for any new files.

#### BACKGROUND COLOR

##### **3- Question : June 30, 2009**

I was working on a model and decided to change the background color and I no longer can see the X\_Y\_Z axis marker, I changed the back ground color back and still can't see the axis marker, how can I get it back?

##### **Answer**

The XYZ axis displayed on the bottom left of the XY of the main window can be activated and deactivated by selecting the option "View/Hide Axes" available from the top menu "View". If your question is not directly related to these axes please let me know.

#### DEFAULT LOCATION, BACKUP FILE

##### **4- Question : August 20, 2009**

Is there a place where we can go to change the default location where the backup file is stored?

##### **Answer**

There are two types of backup files. The first is a file with extension .bak which is the previous version of the file when you save your file. This file is in the same directory than the original file. There is also a file saved from the "AutoSave" command (extension .sav) every 10 minutes by default which is the most up to date file if you forget to save your file. This file is saved in case of a crash. If a crash occurs, the next time you will open SAFI you will get a message to recover the ".sav" file. This file is also in the same directory than the original file.

Please note than Windows hide the file extension by default, which sometimes can cause problem to users to find the correct file.
